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"Carroa" signifies "The Path Leading to Roa"

A name that honors the essential role of this village and its surroundings in the history of this wine. The paths of Ribera del Duero connect villages, people, and stories, witnessing centuries of agriculture and winemaking heritage.

Variety: Tinto Fino

Vineyards: Over 50 years old, located at different altitudes, with various microclimates and soils within the province of Burgos.

Winemaking: Manual harvest.

- Malolactic fermentation followed by **16** months of aging in *French oak barrels*.
- The wine spends an additional 8 months in 12,500 L. French oak vats.
- Final touch in *concrete eggs*.



Notes

Cherry-red color. An elegant, complex, and suggestive wine. Prominent aromas of well-ripened black and red fruits.

Aromatic complexity with subtle notes of vanilla, coconut, spices, cedar, and fine toasts from the French oak barrels.

Velvety and flavorful on the palate. After aging in concrete eggs, it retains freshness while enhancing the volume of the fruit, offering a silky texture.

A cycle with average rainfall and temperatures. A prolonged harvest allowed for optimal selection, resulting in fruits with adequate ripeness.
